This assertion is but partly true. The British colonies, though all endowed with complete self-government, differ very widely in the temper in which they approach the labour problem. For instance, two of the knottiest questions which humanitarian social reformers have endeavoured in our time to solve, are confessedly the conflict of organised capital with organised labour, and the necessity of securing a minimum of comfort for the humbler class of workers. Among eleven self-governing British colonies two only have made any serious endeavour to cope with the second of these problems, and one only has made any determined effort to grapple with the first. Victoria and New Zealand essay to control by statute wages and the conditions of labour; in New Zealand alone the conflicts of labour and capital are...
